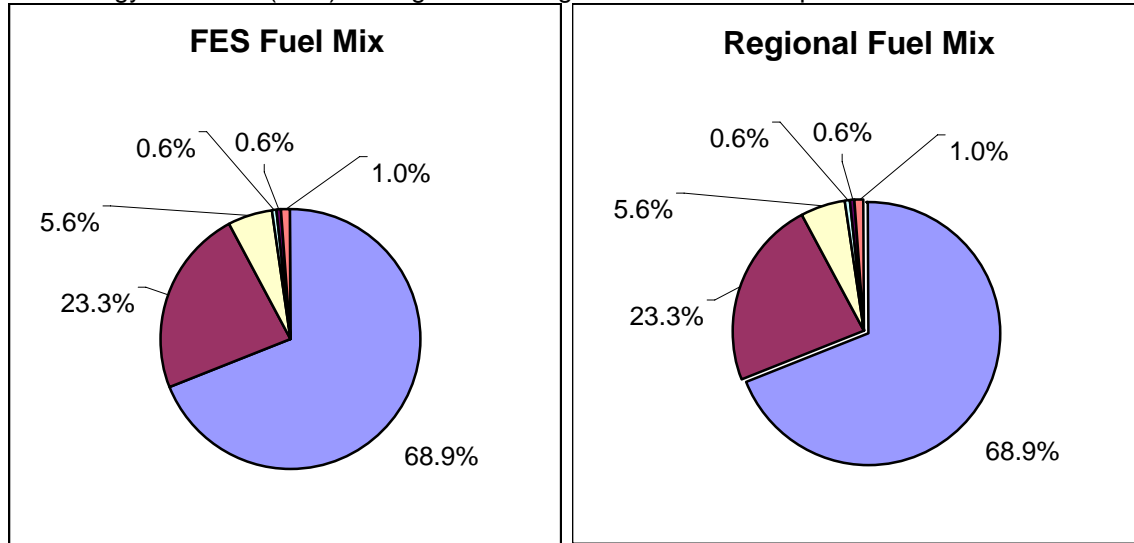

This data is collected irregularly by the Department of Energy; the amount of nuclear fuel burned (and discharged) per megawatt-hour has changed very little in recent years according to DOE.
